## Monthly Devotional From Our Pastor



2019 was the year my frown turned upside down!

Let me explain. I have always enjoyed ministry and have been so proud of all the ministry that happens here at FPC. We have been a busy church! But there was an unrelenting and nagging feeling in the back of mind and sometimes in the forefront. The month to month interpretation of our financial data would bring some months of joy and other months of deep concern. Some of you felt this as well and expressed concerns along the way. Yet there was another very consistent trend at work every year for at least a generation. That trend is expressed in a line graph as a smile.

Diving into the language of the biblical text is what I am trained to do. I thoroughly enjoy time spent in study and the opportunity to preach and teach. But I have never been much of a finance guy. In 2019, I set aside all else for a bit, and with the help of our bookkeeper Russel, went headlong into fiscal records of the past to help me understand the present. What I discovered turned my frown upside down. FPC has a predictable and generational trend to finish the year well. Even though there are predictable months of scarcity in the middle of the year, we finish the year in good shape. My research into our past took me to Google to find that this is, in fact, a predictable trend in many nonprofit organizations. (Oh the things we were not taught in seminary!) I reported a few months ago that the 10-year average end of year report revealed that we finished on average \$2,300 short. That is the definition of “not bad.” But consider this, 2019 has lowered that ten-year average to \_\_\_\_\_. Our trend is not only ministry growth and membership growth, but financial growth as well. Those are indisputable markers for a healthy church. My friends, that is exactly what we are. FPC is a healthy growing and thriving church and the frown of my last few years, my concerns, have given way to the joyful realization that the best is yet to come. I am committed to seeing the big picture

because the big picture is amazing. Yes, there will always be lean times, but our historic trend is healthy, and will continue to be healthy, as we work with passion and with a deep appreciation for the resources of your time, your talent, and your treasure to bring Christ’s kingdom to bear in Turlock and around the world.

Personally, if I had to choose one word to describe how I remember last year, it would be the word humility. Hmmm, no it would be gratitude! Ok, two words for last year, humility and gratitude. Humility when I realized how much I thought I knew that well, I did not, and gratitude for the faithfulness so many of you have demonstrated both last year and for generations.

Now, on another note - my mom just got married!!! 83 years young and looking to the rest of her life with joy-filled anticipation. Holy Smokes! I am still not over the shock. Mom is married and has relocated to North Carolina and is looking forward to being a pastor’s wife because she married an active 82 years young minister. Yeah, I am still in shock. But it all brings a great big smile to my face. In all the courting by phone and plan-making, mom demonstrated tenacity to not let go of life, to not just “grow old gracefully” but to seize the moment and the blessings God has set before her. Does that inspire you? It should. Let each of us in 2020 determine to seize the day and step into the life of the church with joy and enthusiasm. God is working in us and through us and our future is not a frown, but a smile and the reward of a job well done.

With deep humility and gratitude, I would again like to say thank you for giving me the opportunity of being your pastor! The best is yet to come.

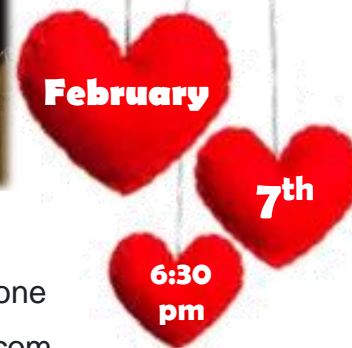
